Exploring our history

The Scottish Fire and Rescue Service Museum and Heritage Centre offers a fascinating insight into the history of firefighting in the West of Scotland.



The Museum is based in the original Greenock Fire Station, in the Municipal Buildings. This old Victorian Fire Station and the firemen who lived and worked here served the communities of Greenock and the surrounding area for more than 70 years, from 1887 until the station closed in 1960.

The fire engines, uniforms and firefighting equipment on display recreate the original atmosphere of the old Fire Station and allow visitors to share the experiences of generations of firefighters through their stories, photographs, uniforms and medals.

Our exhibits and interactive displays bring to life the rich history and traditions of the Service, from the late 1800s right up to the cutting-edge technology, firefighting techniques and community fire safety education that form today's Fire and Rescue Service.

Preserving the past

This Museum and Heritage Centre, which opened in 2012, was delivered in partnership with Strathclyde Fire & Rescue, Inverclyde Council and the Strathclyde Fire & Rescue Preservation Group.

The Museum would not have been possible without the help of many people across the Fire Service community; their dedication is evident throughout the exhibition and should ensure visitors enjoy an interesting and enjoyable experience.

The artefacts on display here have come from an extensive archive, and have been generously donated by many Fire Service families and by the Scottish Fire and Rescue (SFRS) Heritage Trust.

The SFRS Heritage Trust is made up of volunteers who maintain the historic fire engines, uniforms and equipment that showcase the rich history of the Fire Service.
